HAWAII OPIUM TAX

The import of opium was taxed from 1886. At first 1\$ stamp Duty revenue stamps collected the tax. Owing to shortages of this value, The \$1 postage stamp of 1883 was then overprinted J.M.K. (John M. Kapena, Customs collector 1886-87) to collect the tax.



1886. Postage stamp of 1883 overprinted J.M.K. in violet (V).
1. \$1 rose (V) 250.00

Opium was banned from import from 1888 and the stamps withdrawn.
