## NORWAY FERIEFONDET (HOLIDAY FUND)

Before 1947, various holiday savings schemes operated, sometimes jointly arranged betwen trades unions and employers. These varied from industry to industry, but may not have been obligatory. Various savings stamps under these schemes are known. These are essentially private savings stamps (therefore outside the scope of this catalogue). A Holiday Pay Act of 1947 then required all major employers to make a contribution towards paid holidays of staff. This was done by means of nationally-produced stamps (available from the Post Office) affixed to savings cards, which employees could then cash in at Post Offices while on holiday the next year. The scheme was obligatory by  $law, making \, these \, stamps \, a \, form \, of \, National \,$ Insurance.
